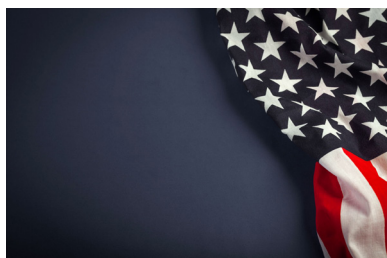
Listed below are key programs Bob has managed:
