DIRECTIONS TO FORT MYER PATTON HALL

Joining us for the June Awards Ceremony?

Below are some tips to make your trip to Fort Myer Patton Hall a little easier for the June Awards Ceremony. We hope to see you there!

- If you do not have an active visitors pass with Ft Myer or from Ft McNair, complete the [New Visitor AIE Pass Application](#) in advance. Plan to arrive at about 11:15 am to allow time for security.
- Non DOD-ID holders are **only** permitted to enter through the Hatfield Gate at Washington Boulevard, 2nd Street South, Fort Myer, Va, 22211. Additional directions are available [here](#).
- To get to Ft Myer Patton Hall Officers Club once on base, from Carpenter Road, turn left onto Sheridan Avenue, then right onto Jackson Avenue. The Club will be on your left. There is a large parking lot on the right, before Patton Hall, or on the left just past the hall near the swimming pool. Patton Hall’s address is 214 Jackson Avenue, Ft Myer 22211.
- There is no metro access to Joint Base Myer. The nearest Metro stop is the Rosslyn station, 0.6 miles from Wright Gate. The Officers Club is another 0.6 miles, or about a 15-20 minute walk from Wright gate, so please plan accordingly. Please call 202-973-8683 if you plan to take a taxi or the Metro.
